18th & 25th December 2016 Sunday Readings: Year A Weekday Readings: Year I

What a difference one letter can make even to the smallest of words. Take "o" for example, arguably the shortest word (if a word at all) can be changed very subtly more powerfully by the addition of a "h" creating "oh". "O" is used before a word or name in direct address, especially in solemn or poetic language, to lend earnestness to an appeal and as an expression of surprise, longing and gladness. "Oh" on the other hand whilst used in a similar way, is used to express a range of panicky emotions including surprise, anger, disappointment, or disbelief. Whilst very similar they are very different, joyful expectation or fearful realisation.

Advent has now reached week four with a week to go until Christmas, and the focus of our readings and thoughts turn to the birth of Jesus Christ, as foretold by the prophets and announced by an angel. Today's Gospel reading tells us how Joseph reacted to the news that his betrothed, Mary, was with child. At first he was shocked, and whilst still loving Mary, decided to divorce her informally to avoid a scandal. However, the angel of the Lord was sent to enlighten Joseph's mind and explain that Mary had conceived by the Holy Spirit and was to give birth to the Christ.

For Joseph, his "oh" of despair, became an "o" of joy.

From the 17 December the antiphon for the Magnificat at Evening Prayer reflects this expectant joy by beginning with a different "o" proclamation until Christmas. These are known as the Advent "O"s and are the basis of the famous Advent carol "O come, o come Emmanuel". It is a reminder to us that Christmas is nearly here and that we should be ready to celebrate Christ's birth and more importantly to be ready for his return. For when Christ does return, we pray that our response to him will be not be "Oh Jesus, you're here" but rather "O Jesus, you're here". Fr Alex
