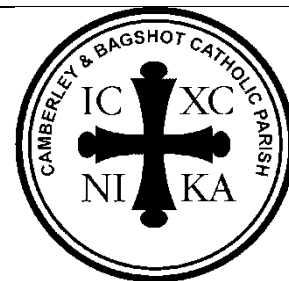

'What's wrong with assisted suicide?' This was the title of the 3rd talk in series by Catholic Voices that is taking at St Tarcisius Church during Lent. Speaking to us last Thursday was William Kent, who began his talk by looking for the shared value between Catholics and those who argue for assisted suicide – that of compassion. Kent explained how the debate can be 'reframed' to show that making assisted suicide legal would not serve compassion, but rather would undermine it. The speaker presented three arguments against assisted suicide; first, that a change in the law would put pressure on the weak and the vulnerable; second, that it would cause us to devalue life, especially life lived with a disability; third, that it would undermine the virtue of hope i.e., a conviction that life has meaning and purpose, and that whatever our circumstances we need not give in to despair. Kent showed how permission for assisted suicide for some limited groups in Belgium and the Netherlands quickly widened to include the young and those who cannot themselves consent. The speaker emphasised that it is not sufficient to be merely *anti* assisted suicide, but rather that Catholics must be *pro* dignity in death, a key teaching of the Catholic Church. Kent also highlighted a useful resource available from the Bishops Conference of England and Wales called *Ars Morendi* – The Art of Dying Well (www.artofdyingwell.org). The topic for next week's talk on March 30th is 'The Reforms of Pope Francis – a Church fit for mission?' All welcome.
